The Public Enterprises Survey 2023-24 is the 64th edition in this series. The Survey provides information relating to Gross
2.2	System of Classification	Revenue, Net Profit of Operating CPSEs & Capital employed, Net Worth, Contribution to Central Exchequer of all CPSEs, employment etc. The PE Survey broadly classifies CPSEs based on its status like Operating, Non-Operating, Under closure, under construction, under liquidation etc.in each Financial Year.
		The survey provides essential statistical data for all CPSEs from various perspectives by segregating these enterprises broadly into various sectors such

		as Agriculture, Mining & Exploration, Manufacturing, Processing & Generation and Services. The sectors are further divided into 20 Cognate Groups. Survey Report is prepared on the basis of the aggregate of financial performance of CPSE based on Cognate and Sector overall.

2.4	Sector coverage	The Public Enterprises Survey traditionally covers, besides certain statutory corporations, those Government companies wherein more than 50% equity is held by the Central Government. The subsidiaries of these companies, if registered in India, where any CPSE has more than 50% equity are also categorized as CPSEs.

6.1	Cabaranas and Campara	Since most of the data for PE Survey is filled up by CPSEs with the help of their Annual Reports / Annual Financial statements (as per time line set by regulatory authority) and other related accounting documents, the Survey can start only when CPSEs have these documents ready or provisional Financial statements are available. As the PE Survey report is placed annually in the Parliament, all efforts are made to collect and process the data in a timely manner so that report can be finalized.
7	Coherence and Compara	bility
7.1	Comparability – over time	PE Survey data are broadly comparable over time. For any change in coverage, definition, tabulation etc. the same are highlighted in the tables/reports. Most of these changes do not warrant a break in series.
7.2	Coherence	The PE survey data is based on Annual Financial statements / Annual Reports of CPSEs, and efforts are made to reconcile with other data sources ,wherever available. Macro level consistency checks are done internally with last year.
